Sportsmanship Checklist for Kids

- I abide by the rules of the game.
- I try to avoid arguments.
- I share in the responsibilities of the team.
- I give everyone a chance to play according to the rules.
- I always play fair.
- I follow the directions of the coach/adult in charge.
- I respect the other team's effort.
- I offer encouragement to my teammates.
- I accept the judgment calls of the game officials.
- I end the game smoothly.

Sportsmanship is the ability to:

- Win without gloating (don't rub it in)
- Lose without complaining (don't make excuses)
- Treat your opponent, and the officials, with respect

Sportsmanship Tips:

- If you make a mistake don't pout or make excuses. Learn from it, and be ready to continue to play.
- If a teammate makes a mistake, encourage, don't criticize.
